

From Pastor Dan

Well, here we are, six months into the COVID 19 pandemic and still trying to find our way. Unfortunately, there seems to be no clear path forward. Some businesses are “business as usual” and some are not; some schools are open and some are not, some churches are worshipping inside and some are not. Nations, states, and communities all seem to have a different take on how to deal with the virus.

Yet, in the midst of these confusing times, St. John has forged ahead providing opportunities for in-person worship in an outside venue throughout the summer. “Yeah,” you say, “that’s all well and good, but it is not the same as worshipping inside.” I agree, it is not. But Jesus said, “For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them.” (“So there!”) Also, as we tried to maintain as much a sense of normalcy as possible over the months, two of those services included the rites of First Communion and Confirmation. Additionally, we have begun in-person Sunday School classes as well as Confirmation classes. We have faithfully done what we thought was best.

So, where do we go from here? At its most recent meeting, your council decided that we will continue outdoor Sunday worship through October. If a service is cancelled because of bad weather, I will provide an abbreviated virtual worship service. In addition, beginning Tuesday, October 6, the sanctuary will be open every Tuesday from 8AM to 8PM for prayer and meditation. As far as what worship beyond October might look like, the council will continue to monitor the situation and will determine the status of worship services on a month to month basis.

Six months in and we are still navigating the murky waters of COVID 19. Your council is concerned and engaged as we try to do what we think is best for St. John. As we continue to journey forward, I encourage us to do it together; not without discussion, not without compromise, and not even without dissent, but together. The gathering hymn from a recent Sunday worship speaks to my earnest desire for what that can look like, “We are pilgrims on a journey, we are travelers on the road; we are here to help each other walk the mile and bear the load.”
