⁷You shall not make wrongful use of the name of the LORD your God, for the LORD will not acquit anyone who misuses his name.

¹³You shall not murder.


¹⁴You shall not commit adultery.

He also poured out the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables. ¹⁶He told those who were selling the doves, "Take these things out of here! 



LORD'S PRAYER


