## From Pastor Maggie

Beloved Community,

Grace and peace to you all as we step into the summer season!

As the days grow longer and the light lingers into the evening, we are invited once again into a season of connection—with our Creator God and with one another. Summer has a way of opening space for gathering: those who travel south for the winter return home, visitors fill our pews, and our shared life as a congregation takes on a different rhythm of worship, fellowship, and service.

This year is especially meaningful as we celebrate our 160th anniversary as a congregation. ## *“Council Corner”*

I would like to start off with a "thank you" to everyone that helped with the project day at the beginning of May. We were able to get a lot done even with it starting off the day with some rain. This is my second year organizing this as a trustee and I appreciate the many hands that helped take care of the buildings and property around them.

Onto our next project, the parking lot. The parking lot presentation was Sunday, May 17th after our regular service. It was nice that many of you were able to stick around to listen, ask questions and provide feedback. Option 4 was chosen through voting. This option included adding an addition gravel parking area to the West end of the black top area and complete redo of all existing black top including striping. Current black top will be removed along with the base that is under it. New base material will be added and new black top put down. Along with this the plan is to bury downspouts and sump pump discharge and run them to the storm drain. The septic line that runs to the mound system will be upgraded. This will be an investment that looks at quality, longevity and safety. We did add additional handicap and limited mobility parking spots close to the entrance of the church.

Option #1 - 0

Option #2 - 1

Option #3 - 4

Option #4 – 88

During multiple meetings, we discussed how to communicate the cost of the parking lot project in a way that feels meaningful and manageable for our congregation. Several ideas were shared, but one phrase especially stood out: **“A dollar a day for 365 days.”**

If every giving unit contributed just one dollar a day for three years, we would be able to repay the loan for the project. Of course, we recognize that each household’s circumstances are different. Some may be able to give more, while others may not be able to give as much. Every gift, no matter the size, is deeply appreciated.

The trustees are also looking into the age and condition of "critical" equipment in both the church and parsonage so that we can be more proactive with planning and budgeting for repair or replacement of this equipment.

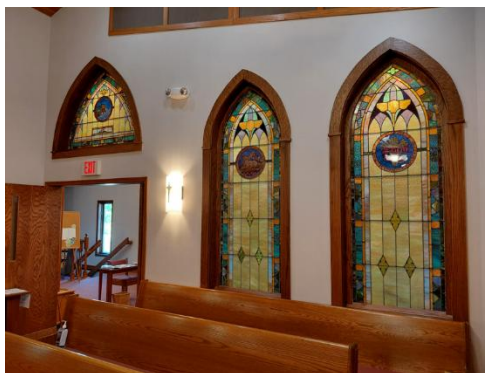
## “Did you know?” By Tim Ohrmundt

I have the privilege of ringing those bells now. Bells that will continue to ring as long as we have faith. Because faith brought us from where we were and will carry us to where we are going.

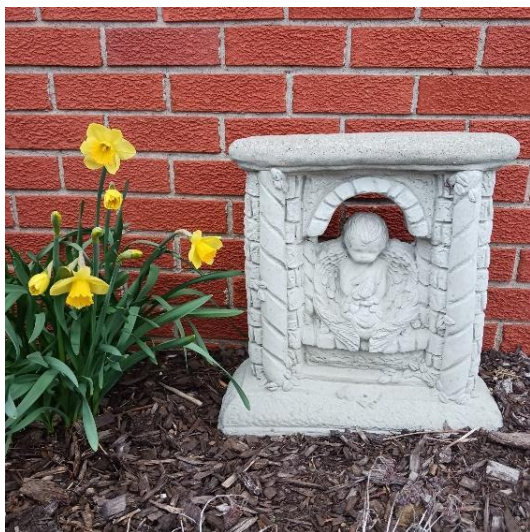


## Gratitude for Loretta & Linda
